#### **State Overview**

As of February 2022, 728,359 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹ It is estimated that as of 2016, 22,900 people were living with HCV in Mississippi.² Mississippi's Medicaid Program operates a fee-for-service (FFS) program and contracts with managed care organizations (MCOs). Most beneficiaries, 99.4 percent, are enrolled in a MCO and the remaining 0.6 percent participate in FFS.³ The MCO program is known as the Mississippi Coordinated Access Network (MississippiCAN)⁴, which is serviced by three health insurance plans: Magnolia Health⁵, United Healthcare⁶, and Molina Healthcare⁶.

The Mississippi Medicaid Preferred Drug List includes Mavyret and sofosbuvir/velpatasvir.8
