


Hepatitis C: State of Medicaid Access Report Card

New Jersey



Grade	Recommendations to Improve Patient Access
C	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Remove prior authorization for HCV treatment. Publish FFS HCV coverage criteria. Ensure transparency and parity across FFS and MCOs regarding HCV coverage criteria.

State Overview

As of February 2022, 2,076,235 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹ It is estimated that as of 2016, 47,600 people were living with HCV in New Jersey.² New Jersey Medicaid operates a fee-for-service (FFS) program and contracts with managed care organizations (MCOs). Most beneficiaries, 96 percent, are enrolled in an MCO. The remaining 4 percent participate in FFS.³ New Jersey Medicaid contracts with five MCOs: Aetna Better Health of New Jersey (Aetna), Amerigroup RealSolutions (Amerigroup), Horizon NJ Health (Horizon), UnitedHealthcare Community Plan (UHC) and WellCare.⁴

New Jersey Medicaid does not use a Preferred Drug List.⁵

Prior Authorization	-8	Prior authorization is required for all HCV treatment regimens. ⁶
Fibrosis Restrictions	0	New Jersey Medicaid does not impose fibrosis restrictions. ⁷
Substance Use Restrictions	0	New Jersey Medicaid does not impose substance use restrictions. ⁸
Prescriber Restrictions	0	New Jersey Medicaid does not impose prescriber restrictions. ⁹
Retreatment Restrictions	0	New Jersey Medicaid does not impose retreatment restrictions. ¹⁰
Access in Managed Care	-8	UHC and WellCare impose more stringent restrictions than FFS. UHC appears to require a specialist to prescribe treatment. ¹¹ WellCare's PA form states: "Urine toxicology within the past 30 days" and "Substance or alcohol use: Patients with active substance or alcohol use disorders should be considered for therapy on a case-by-case basis, and care should be coordinated with substance use treatment specialists." ¹² Aetna ¹³ , Amerigroup ¹⁴ , and Horizon ¹⁵ follow the same criteria as FFS.
Additional Restrictions	-8	Additional restrictions could not be assessed as New Jersey Medicaid does not publish clinical criteria nor publish a prior authorization form for HCV treatment. ¹⁶ An 8-point deduction was given due to lack of transparency about clinical coverage criteria.

New Jersey Medicaid does not publish clinical criteria nor publish a prior authorization form for HCV treatment. Treatment access was evaluated using Drug Utilization Review Board minutes. The unpublished *Protocol for Direct Acting Antiviral Hepatitis C Drugs (Updated Jul. 1, 2021)* shared by email from the NJ Department of Human Services Office of Public Communications was not used to evaluate treatment access.
