State Overview

As of October 2023, 3,152,322 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹ It is estimated that as of 2016, 89,600 people were living with HCV in Ohio.² Ohio operates a fee-for-service (FFS) program and contracts with managed care organizations (MCOs). Most beneficiaries, 91 percent, are enrolled in an MCO. The remaining 9 percent participate in FFS or limited benefits managed care programs.³ Ohio Medicaid contracts with seven MCOs: Buckeye Community Health Plan, CareSource, Molina Healthcare of Ohio, Humana, AmeriHealth Caritas, Anthem and UnitedHealthcare Community Plan.⁴ Ohio Medicaid uses a unified Preferred Drug List for all MCOs.⁵ Ohio excludes Medicaid pharmacy benefits from MCO contracts, thus all MCOs follow FFS requirements.⁶

The Ohio Medicaid Preferred Drug List designates Mavyret and sofosbuvir/velpatasvir as preferred regimens.⁷
