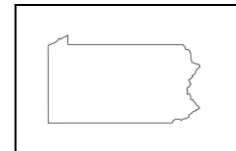


Hepatitis C: State of Medicaid Access Report Card

Grade	Recommendations to Improve Patient Access

State Overview

As of October 2023, 117,430 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹ It is estimated that as of 2016, 3,700 people were living with HCV in South Dakota.² South Dakota Medicaid does not contract with any managed care organizations (MCOs). Instead, 66 percent of Medicaid enrollees in South Dakota are enrolled in a Primary Care Case Management (PCCM) program, with the other 34% enrolled in FFS.³ South Dakota Medicaid contracts with OptumRx to process pharmacy claims and pharmacy prior authorizations.⁴

South Dakota Medicaid has a limited Preferred Drug List that includes Mavyret and sofosbuvir/velpatasvir.⁵
