State Overview

As of October 2023, 1,945,030 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹ It is estimated that as of 2016, 54,200 people were living with HCV in Washington.² Most beneficiaries, 87.8 percent, are enrolled in an MCO plan, 12.2 percent participate in FFS, and less than 1 percent are in a Primary Care Case Management program.³ Washington Medicaid contracts with five MCOs: Community Health Plan of Washington, Coordinated Care of Washington, Molina Healthcare of Washington, UnitedHealthcare Community Plan, and Wellpoint Washington (formerly Amerigroup).⁴

The Washington Medicaid Preferred Drug List⁵ lists Mavyret as the preferred regimen pursuant to a modified subscription model contract.⁶
