Grade Rationale: Massachusetts has dramatically increased access to hepatitis C medications in response to strong advocacy. All Medicaid beneficiaries have access to treatment and there is parity across FFS and MCOs. The state serves
	as a model for other Medicaid programs.

Background

As of June 2017, Massachusetts had 1,638,116 individuals enrolled in Medicaid, known as MassHealth.² Over half of MassHealth enrollees, 53 percent, are enrolled in a Managed Care Organization (MCO). Six MCOs serve MassHealth: Boston Medical Center HealthNet Plan, Neighborhood Health Plan, Health New England, Fallon Community Health Plan, Tufts Health Plan and CeltiCare Health.³ The remaining enrollees participate in either the Fee-For-Service (FFS) program (20 percent), or the Primary Care Case Management (PCCM) system (27 percent).⁴ In 2006, Massachusetts reformed its health care system to provide near universal health insurance coverage for its residents.⁵ The state has achieved 98 percent coverage which is the best in the nation.⁶

State of Medicaid Hepatitis C Treatment Access

MassHealth has dramatically increased access to hepatitis C medications. While MassHealth members participating in the FFS program had open access, those receiving care from MCOs faced onerous restrictions.⁷ Previously, MCOs required severe liver damage (F3 or greater) and 12 months abstinence from alcohol and illicit substance use.⁸ MCOs also required a specialist to prescribe.⁹

After significant patient and health care provider advocacy, MassHealth announced it would expand hepatitis C treatment access. Effective August 1, 2016, MassHealth MCOs were directed to remove all restrictions related to liver damage, sobriety and prescriber specialty.¹⁰ All beneficiaries now have unrestricted access to hepatitis C medications. ¹¹ FFS and MCOs require a diagnosis of chronic hepatitis C and do not impose any liver damage, lsobriety or prescribing requirements.¹² Beneficiaries must be at least 18 years old to qualify for treatment.¹³ FFS and MCO impose quantity and duration limits (from 12 to 24 weeks), which vary depending on the prescribed regimen.¹⁴ Additionally, FFS/PCCM and MCOs require documentation of HCV RNA lab results at weeks four and six of treatment to receive approval for treatment continuation.¹⁵

MassHealth FFS/PCCM's Preferred Drug List (PDL) includes the following Direct-Acting Antivirals (DAAs): preferred (Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi,) and non-preferred (Daklinza, Olysio, Technivie, Viekira XR, Viekira Pak, Zepatier).¹⁶ MCO formularies are established by each plan and most require hepatitis C regimens to be filled at specialty pharmacies. Boston Medical Health Net Plan covers the following DAAs: preferred (Daklinza, Harvoni, Sovaldi) and non-preferred (Olysio, Viekira XR, Viekira Pak, Technivie, Epclusa, Zepatier).¹⁷ Boston Medical Health Net Plan requires specialty medications, including hepatitis C regimens, to be dispensed at one of two contracted specialty pharmacies: Diplomat or Walgreens Specialty.¹⁸ Neighborhood Health Plan's formulary includes the following preferred DAAs: Daklinza, Epclusa, Harvoni and Sovaldi.¹⁹ Health New England has separate prior authorization (PA) forms and clinical guidelines for each hepatitis C regimen; however, the coverage requirements conform to FFS criteria.²⁰ Health New England's formulary includes the following DAAs: preferred (Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi) and non-preferred (Daklinza, Olysio, Technivie, Viekira XR, Viekira Pak, Zepatier). These medications must be dispensed at a specialty pharmacy.²¹ Fallon Community Health Plan also requires hepatitis C prescriptions to be filled through CVS Caremark Specialty Pharmacy mail-order and prescriptions are limited to a 30 day supply.²² I tappears Fallon Community Health Plan establishes all DAA regimens as preferred (Daklinza, Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi, Technivie, Viekira XR, Viekira Pak, Zepatier).²³ CeltiCare Health includes the following DAAs on its formulary: Daklinza, Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi and Zepatier.²⁴ Tufts Health Plan's formulary includes the following DAAs on its formulary: Daklinza, Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi and Zepatier.²⁴ Tufts Health Plan's formulary includes the following the following DAAs on its formulary: Daklinza, Epclusa, Harvoni, Sovaldi and Zepatier.²⁴ Tufts Health Plan'



MassHealth is transparent regarding its hepatitis C coverage requirements. The state responded to the NVHR/CHLPI survey requesting information on hepatitis C coverage criteria.

Liver Damage (Fibrosis) Restrictions

MassHealth FFS/PCCM and MCOs require a diagnosis of chronic hepatitis C and do not have liver damage requirements.²⁷ The FFS/PCCM and MCOs PA forms state "staging information must clearly demonstrate early stage (F0 to F2) or advanced liver disease (F3 to F4)."28 The PA forms request other clinical information such as HIV and/or hepatitis B co-infection, post-liver transplant and liver cancer.²⁹

Sobriety Restrictions

MassHealth FFS/PCCM does not impose any sobriety requirements.³⁰ However, the PA form requests if the beneficiary has a substance use disorder as well as if a beneficiary with current substance use is presently enrolled in a substance use or alcohol support program.³¹ The MCOs do not impose any sobriety requirements.³²

Prescriber Restrictions

MassHealth FFS/PCCM and MCOs do not specify any prescribing requirements on their PA forms.³³ Tufts Health Plan's PA form requests if the prescriber is a gastroenterologist, hepatologist or infectious disease specialist.³⁴ However, Tufts Health Plan's publicly available criteria state that the specialist prescribing requirement was removed in July 2016.35
