Rubric - June 2022

All states start with 100 points, from which states may lose points, as described below.

Prior Authorization	Criteria: • If a state requires prior authorization, the state loses 8 points. For purposes of this rubric, a state is considered to not impose prior authorization if no prior authorization is required for preferred regimens and/or for simplified treatment, even if it is required in other circumstances.				
Fibrosis Restrictions	Criteria: If a state imposes any restrictions based on fibrosis score, the state loses 12 points.				
Substance Use Restrictions	 Criteria: If a state imposes a period of abstinence prior to treatment, a period of abstinence during treatment, requires participation in a substance use treatment program, and/or requires patient to sign a consent form acknowledging treatment will be discontinued if patient is not abstinent, the state loses 12 points. If a state requires screening or counseling related to drug or alcohol use, but does not condition treatment on the patient's sobriety, the state loses 4 points. 				
Prescriber Restrictions	Oriteria: If a state requires that simplified treatment be prescribed by a specialist or in consultation with a specialist, or requires completion of a provider training program (e.g., ECHO) to prescribe, the state loses 8 points.				
Retreatment Restrictions	If a state prohibits retreatment for individuals who have either failed treatment or become re-infected, or if a state allows retreatment but imposes criteria based on adherence or substance use that are more burdensome than those imposed on initial therapy, the state loses 8 points.				
Access in Managed Care	Criteria: If one or more of a state's contracted managed care organizations (MCOs) impose more severe restrictions than the state fee-for-service plan, or if any MCO does not publish HCV treatment coverage criteria, the state loses 8 points.				
Additional Restrictions	 Criteria: If a state requires any labs to be collected within a specific timeframe, the state loses 2 points. If a state requires documentation or confirmation of chronic infection, the state loses 2 points. If a state requires documentation of genotype, the state loses 2 points. If a state restricts refills for lost/stolen medication, the state loses 2 points. If a state requires documentation of adherence assessment or counseling, or withholds treatment due to lack of adherence, the state loses 2 points. Evaluators may deduct points for other treatment access limitations, at the team's discretion (e.g., mid-treatment viral load testing for refills; dispensing limitations; transparency related to HCV treatment access policies; etc.)
