


# Hepatitis C: State of Medicaid Access Report Card

## Wyoming



Grade	Recommendations to Improve Patient Access
<b>B</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Remove prior authorization for HCV treatment.</li><li>Remove limit of one course of treatment per lifetime.</li><li>Remove additional restrictions as described below.</li></ul>

### State Overview

As of August 2025, 60,814 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP. Wyoming has not expanded coverage to low-income adults.<sup>1</sup> It is estimated that as of 2016, 3,700 people were living with HCV in Wyoming.<sup>2</sup> Wyoming does not contract with any Managed Care Organizations (MCOs).<sup>3</sup> Thus, hepatitis C coverage requirements are uniform throughout the program.

The Wyoming Medicaid Preferred Drug List designates Mavyret and sofosbuvir/velpatasvir as preferred regimens.<sup>4</sup>

Deductions		Policy
Prior Authorization	-8	Prior authorization is required for all HCV treatment regimens. <sup>5</sup>
Fibrosis Restrictions		Wyoming Medicaid does not impose fibrosis restrictions. <sup>6</sup>
Substance Use Restrictions		Wyoming Medicaid does not impose substance use restrictions. <sup>7</sup>
Prescriber Restrictions		Wyoming Medicaid does not impose prescriber restrictions. <sup>8</sup>
Retreatment Restrictions	-8	Wyoming Medicaid appears to impose retreatment restrictions. The Prior Authorization Form notes that Wyoming allows only one course of treatment per lifetime. <sup>9</sup> However, the Preferred Drug List notes that "SVR 12 will be required for consideration for retreatment." <sup>10</sup>
Access in Managed Care		Wyoming does not contract with MCOs. <sup>11</sup>
Additional Restrictions	-4	Wyoming Medicaid imposes additional restrictions as follows <sup>12</sup> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Documentation of HCV genotype.</li><li>Documentation of adherence counseling: Wyoming Medicaid requires the prescriber to document patient's ability to adhere to treatment via a psychosocial readiness survey, PREP-C. Additionally, Wyoming Medicaid requires a commitment form to be signed by the patient and provider. The form notes that: "Non-compliance with the prescribed Hepatitis C regimen may put the client in jeopardy for denial of coverage in the future."<sup>13</sup></li></ul>
